Do's & Don'ts for Taking the Best Photos of Your Property!

Do...

- Open up blinds, turn on all lights
- Hold your phone camera horizontally
- Tidy up the area, put everything away, move trash cans out of view
- Plan your photography based on good weather (if it's supposed to rain today but sunny tomorrow, choose to photograph your property tomorrow)
- Ensure grounds are picked up, recently mowed, and landscaping beds are free of weeds
- Take multiple angles of the same area then choose the best to use

Don't...

- Take close ups of items or rooms we need broad views to get a sense of where everything is and how the space can be used
- Take photos of anyone's personal information
- Be Seen! reflection on doors, windows, mirrors, and shadows
- Use people in photos
