BESA

BESA is a Columbus Ohio based not-for-profit with a mission to connect more people to community service, encouraging others to give back by means of volunteering. BESA, led by Matthew Goldstein, has been volunteering for N^M for more than 7 years, starting with our Centers for Senior Health. For several years, BESA has included our residents at Stygler Commons in their Christmas Adopt-A-Resident program and, in 2018, included residents at Cherry Blossom, Worthington East and Commons at Grant.

She oversees many activities with her church members at Padua Hills and also gives much of her own time and resources to our residents. Debi is known by the residents as “The Church Lady.” Debi takes residents to medical appointments, to visit the local animal shelter, calls to “check in” on residents and, just generally makes everyone feel special. Debi is described by the residents as having transformed Padua Hills and has become an integral part of the community.
